TOWN COUNCIL MINUTES
JUNE 4, 2018

The Thorntown Town Council met on June 4, 2018, at the Town Hall. The meeting was called to order at 7:00 PM by Vice President Koren Gray.

The meeting opened with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Present were Council members Mark Garing, John Shives, Bruce Burtner and Koren Gray. Don Johnson was absent.

Also present were Angie Moody, Marshal Russ Voils, Clerk-Treasurer John Gillan and Frank Small.

Two members of the public were present.

Minutes: Koren asked that the minutes of May 21, 2018, be amended to indicate that she had concerns about finances for the police department if the number of reserves was increased. John moved to accept the amended minutes. Bruce seconded the motion and it passed 4-0.

REPORTS

Park: Repairs and maintenance ongoing.

Discussion of having a beer garden at the park for a fund raiser. Koren-other groups may want to bring alcohol into park. Frank-Churches will be against. John S-beer garden would be fine any place but the park. Mark-100% for. Russ-Area would have to be fenced off where alcohol is sold. Mark moved to allow alcohol to be sold for this fund raiser at the park. John S seconded the motion. Vote was a 2-2 tie. Clerk-Treasurer John Gillan broke the tie with a nay vote. Motion failed.

Development: Alley paving has been completed. ADA ramps have been completed. Street paving to begin next week followed by pothole repair.

Rails to Trails are working on getting trail completed from Clinton County line to Zionsville.

Internet and cable TV lines are down in various parts of town. Suggest talking to town attorney and sending letters to the various providers.
